## UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN SAN ANTONIO-NEW BRAUNFELS MSA DECREASES TO 3.3 PERCENT Workforce Solutions Alamo Releases April 2022 Job Market Information

(May 20, 2022) San Antonio, Texas – Workforce Solutions Alamo (WSA) reports that the April unemployment rate for the eightcounty San Antonio-New Braunfels metropolitan statistical area (MSA) is 3.3 %, a decrease of 0.2 percentage points over the month, from the March rate of 3.5%. Since April of 2021 the MSA unemployment rate dropped 2.1 percentage points from a rate of 5.4%. The April unemployment rate for the San Antonio-New Braunfels metropolitan statistical area (MSA) is lower than the state's not seasonally adjusted (actual) rate of 3.7%.

Summarizing the **not-seasonally adjusted (actual)** unemployment rates for the state and the nation, the Texas not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased 0.2 points to 3.7 percent in April, from a March rate of 3.9 percent. The rate decreased in 13 of the last 15 months. The April rate is 8.4 points below the peak value of 12.1 percent recorded in April 2020. Since April 2021, the unemployment rate dropped 2.2 percentage points from a reading of 5.9 percent.

The U.S. not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased 0.5 percentage points to 3.3 percent in April from 3.8 percent in March. Since April 2021 the unemployment rate dropped 2.4 percentage points from a reading of 5.7 percent, dropping annually in each of the last thirteen months.

Since April of 2021, **51,100** jobs were added, resulting in an annual increase of **4.9%**. **Eight of eleven major industries showed monthly gains:** Leisure and Hospitality, Financial Activity, Education and Health Services, Manufacturing, Other Services, Mining and Logging, the information industry, Construction.

**Monthly job loss occurred in three major industries:** Trade Transportation and Utilities, Professional and Business Services, and Government. During the month of April most of the major industries reached a positive annual growth rate.
