## **UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN SAN ANTONIO-NEW BRAUNFELS MSA DECREASED TO 3.1 PERCENT**

Workforce Solutions Alamo Releases December 2023 Job Market Information

(January 19, 2024) San Antonio, Texas – Workforce Solutions Alamo (WSA) reports that the December unemployment rate for the eight-county San Antonio-New Braunfels metropolitan statistical area (MSA) is 3.1 percent, lower than the 3.2 rate in November. This marks the fourth consecutive monthly decrease. Since December of 2022, the MSA unemployment rate decreased by one tenth of a point (0.1) over the year from a rate of 3.2 percent. The December 2023 unemployment rate for the San Antonio-New Braunfels metropolitan statistical area (MSA) is lower than the state's not seasonally adjusted (actual) rate of 3.5 percent for December 2023. The Civilian Labor Force for the MSA decreased by 5,658 individuals over the month and indicated an increase in the labor force of 40,157 individuals over the year.

# **Labor Force Summary**

**The Texas not seasonally adjusted** unemployment rate was unchanged over the month at 3.5 percent in December 2023. The unemployment rate also held flat compared to the December 2022 rate of 3.5 percent.

**The U.S. not seasonally adjusted** unemployment rate was unchanged over the month, registering at 3.5 percent in December 2023. The rate increased annually by two tenths of a point from the December 2022 rate of 3.3 percent.

# Texas & The Nation (Seasonally Adjusted Rates) Comparison Labor Force Summary

The Texas unemployment rate decreased to 4.0 percent in December 2023 after registering 4.1 percent for seven consecutive months. The rate rose annually by two tenths of a point from a rate of 3.8 percent in December 2022.

The U.S. unemployment rate held flat at 3.7 percent in December 2023 and rose annually by two tenths of a point from a rate of 3.5 percent in December 2022.

## Jobs in the San Antonio-New Braunfels Metropolitan Statistical Area

Since December of 2022, **36,700 jobs** were added to the MSA, resulting in an annual increase of **3.2** percent.





**Five of eleven major industries showed monthly gains, three remained steady.** The industry with the largest monthly gain was Trade Transportation and Utilities, followed by Leisure and Hospitality, Professional and Business Services, Government, and Financial Activities. **Three industries remained steady,** Mining and Logging, Construction, and Manufacturing. Most industries achieved a positive annual growth rate.

**Monthly job losses occurred in three major industries:** Information, Private Education and Health Services, and Other Services indicated a job loss over the month; however, most industries achieved a positive annual growth rate.
