**(September 16, 2025) San Antonio, Texas** – This September, Workforce Solutions Alamo (WSA) celebrates Workforce Development month by recognizing the importance of building a skilled, diverse and future-ready workforce across its 13-county Alamo region.

As the local workforce development leader, WSA’s mission is to empower individuals, strengthen businesses and build stronger communities by connecting people to training, education, childcare and employment opportunities.

Each year, WSA impacts thousands of lives by providing access to resources that help families achieve self-sufficiency through meaningful employment and by ensuring employers have the skilled talent needed to grow.

In 2024, Workforce Solutions Alamo,

- Served thousands of individuals including adults, youth and young adults exploring their first career to people with unique abilities and experienced workers facing sudden layoffs or new career opportunities.
- Received over 99,000 unique visitors and provided more than 304,000 services.
- Connected more than 2,000 youth and young adults to services through WSA career exploration fairs, paid work experiences and training programs.
- Provided quality care for more than 13,000 children daily, giving parents the confidence and support to return to work or complete training.

“While our work is year-long, this month provides an opportunity to spotlight the services and resources we provide and the real impact our work has on people’s lives,” said Adrian Lopez, CEO of Workforce Solutions Alamo. “We are providing access to life-changing, career pathways; and together with our partners, we are helping shape a strong, vibrant, and competitive workforce of the future for our region.”

From career training to childcare resources, WSA is committed to equipping people in our 13-county region with the tools they need to succeed.

- Ready to Work – Helping residents earn credentials and transition into high-wage, high-demand careers.
- PROWD (Pathway Reentry Opportunities for Workforce Development) – Guiding justice-involved individuals toward meaningful employment and stability.
- WIOA Services – Career coaching, tuition assistance, and certifications for adults, youth, and dislocated workers.
- Child Care Services – Making quality childcare accessible and affordable for working families.
- Workforce One Mobile Unit – Bringing career services directly to neighborhoods and rural areas.
- Industry-Specific Initiatives – Addressing talent pipelines in key industries like manufacturing, IT/cybersecurity, healthcare, trades, and aerospace.
- Employer Engagement – Connecting local businesses to qualified talent through job fairs, recruitment events, and custom solutions.

Each Wednesday, WSA hosts job fairs across the region known as “Workforce Wednesdays”, bringing together job seekers and employers for on-the-spot hiring opportunities. This September, events will be held weekly at multiple WSA career centers, including San Antonio, Kerrville, and Boerne. Schedules and employer participation vary by location .
